PROJECT OVERVIEW



DBi Services provides comprehensive snow and ice response to VDOT for Interstate 66 in Northern Virginia (NOVA).

This project consists of 63 centerline miles and 507 lane miles of I-66 from mile marker 75 outside of Washington DC to mile marker 13 in Warren County, Virginia.

The project spans 5 counties in the Commonwealth of Virginia along a heavily travelled interstate leading to Washington DC.

Project Highlights

DBi Services has 112 pieces of snow removal equipment on this project which is tracked in real-time using a customized GPS system. During large snow events, DBi Services controls over 200 equipment operators.

DBi Services works closely with VDOT to ensure highway safety and peak performance of the project.

DBi Services' I-66 project made national news in 2009 for keeping the corridor open during one of the worst blizzards in Virginia's history.

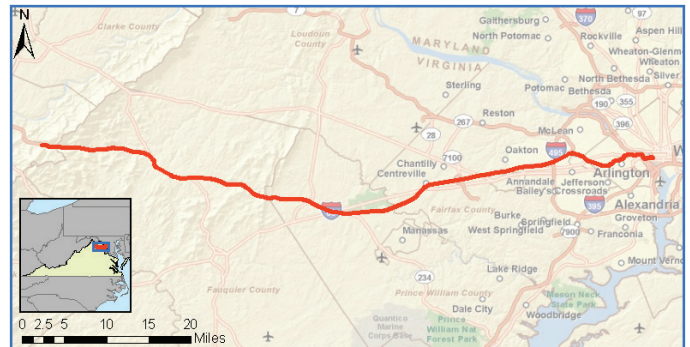
DBi Services has consistently achieved all performance objectives on this project, even during the most severe weather events.
